- 1. Support legislation to fund, design and construct a bike and pedestrian pathway to connect the existing Prairie Sunset Trail (Garden Plain to Hoover Road) to the Redbud Trail including the extension of the Redbud Trail to Iola, KS. - 2. Support pending legislation to reduce "distracted driving" caused by the use of cell phones by motorists to improve traffic safety for all roadway users, including bicyclists and pedestrians.
- Support legislation that helps clarify the legal ability to operate motorized vehicles on off-street pathways and on-street bikeways.
- Support legislation that improves consistency between state law and city ordinances regarding the use of electric assist and motorized bicycles on off-street pathways and on-street bikeways.
