Some activities will take place outside normal class schedule. Age 16+ Prerequisite: Level 1 and 2 of DSLR classes or permission of the class instructor. Equipment/Supplies: Personal DSLR Camera and related DSLR manual, media cards, batteries and any accessories that you own such as tripod. We will discuss how to buy a good tripod in class. LANDSCAPE PHOTOGRAPHY

The first assignment in this class is planning and preparing for a landscape shoot, including knowing the gear you will want to carry. Next, we will move into the critical topics of composition, lighting and exposure for photographing landscapes. Post processing and editing will also be discussed. This four-week course requires that you get out and take a photo on assignment and submit it to be discussed in the next class. You may use any camera for this course. The principals discussed in class will be based upon the best practices for landscape photography. Age 16+

You will be presented with examples of works by different artists of the Western and Eastern tradition as well as a demonstration of the media at the beginning of each class period. By the end of the course, you will have a firm understanding of this method of drawing. Age 10+
