GLOSSARY OF TERMS

Agrarian: Rural, pertaining to agriculture.

Agriculture: The use of land primarily for farming, ranching, horse breeding, and other forms of food and crop production.

Annexation: The process by which a municipality incorporates land into its jurisdiction.

Appraisal: An estimate of the value of property, prepared by a person qualified to evaluate that type of property.

Architectural Review: A review system that ensures acceptable design quality and seeks to guard against development that will have a negative effect on property values of surrounding properties or damage the community appearance.

Arterial: A street whose primary function is to move traffic between areas of the region and across the region, and secondly, to provide access to abutting property.

CDB: Central Business District

Census: A periodic enumeration of the entire population, selected subpopulations or other specialized items, to produce a data base.

CIP: Capital Improvement Program; generally reflects a 3-5 year planning period.

Comprehensive Plan: An official document that serves as a guide to the long-range physical development of a city or planning area.

County: Refers to one of two items depending on the context of usage. 1) The Sedgwick County governmental organization. 2) The unincorporated or non-municipal portions of Sedgwick County.

Cluster Development: Dwelling units grouped together on a site allowing for a higher density through smaller lots, reduced setbacks and common open space.

Collector Street: A street whose function is to provide for traffic movement between arterials and local streets and to provide direct access to abutting property.

Community Unit Plans: A plan which incorporates single-family and/or higher-density residential, commercial and institutional uses so as to develop a unified mixed-use environment.

CPO: Citizen Participation Organizations and their elected representatives for neighborhood districts throughout the City of Wichita.

Demographic: The study of population and its characteristics.

Development Plan Review: A procedure in which proposed site plans are reviewed for compliance with all requirements of the zoning ordinance, municipal site plan regulations and any other appropriate ordinances. Items reviewed may include bulk, height, design and the arrangement of all structures on the site and the relationship of those structures to the site's environmental features and to surrounding land uses.

Downzone: To lower the intensity of a zoning district through a rezoning. i.e. multi-family to single-family.

Environmental Review: A process by which the environmental impacts of development land use are assessed and appropriate actions are recommended and implemented.

EPA: Environmental Protection Agency.

Eutrophication: A process by which nutrients stimulate aquatic plant growth leading to the aging of a water body.

Expressway: A highway which functions to move high volumes of traffic over long distances at high travel speeds. Expressways have partial control of access with some at-grade intersections and some grade-separated interchanges.

Fees in Lieu of Land: An alternative to compulsory land dedication which requires or allows a development to pay a fee that represents the value of a site or improvement that would have been dedicated or provided to the public. The fee is earmarked for a specific purpose for that geographic area, parks, school site, etc.

Floodplains: A low and generally flat plain along the course of a stream that is naturally subject to flooding. Usually, the 100 year floodplain identified by the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA).

Freeway: An expressway with complete access control with grade-separated interchanges handling all entering and existing traffic.

Habitat: The native environment of an animal or plant.

HUD: The U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development.

Incorporate: To legally create or form a municipality.

Infill: A process by which vacant land in developed areas is utilized for new development.

Infrastructure: Traditionally considered to be public services such as streets, roads, sewer and water lines and other utilities.

Land Use: The utilization of land for a specific purpose: the activity or development characteristic of a given parcel of land.

Leapfrog Development: A pattern of growth in which vacant parcels adjacent to existing development are bypassed and land farther away from existing urbanization develops instead.

Level of service "C": A rating which reflects the capability of a roadway or intersection segment to handle traffic flows at a stable or satisfactory rate.

Non-conforming Use: Land uses or activities which are allowed, legally, to continue since they were permitted prior to current ordinances and remain in operation.

Non-point Source Pollution: One or more of various discharges that contribute to water pollution, deriving from sources including agriculture, irrigation, urban run-off and septic systems, etc.

Old Town: The old warehouse district between Washington to Topeka and Waterman to Second Street that is currently being redeveloped.

Planned **Industrial** Development: Industrial developments which are done as a planned unit to ensure compatibility and control.

Residential Street: A road that primarily provides access to abutting property and for intra-neighborhood movement; typically has low traffic volumes and low speeds.

Right-of-way: The strip of land reserved for a linear transit element or utility elements or other public purpose.

Riparian: Pertaining to a natural watercourse.

Rural: The unincorporated area of **Sedgwick** County.

Sedimentation: The settling out of the soil particles transported by water.

Special Assessments: Extra fees passed on to the home buyer that reflect costs for such items as water, sewer, roads and sidewalk improvements.

Subdivision: The division of a lot, tract or parcel of land into two or more lots, tracts, parcels or other divisions of land for sale or development.

Suburban: Development located outside the boundaries of an incorporated municipality which does not receive the benefit of full urban level services (i.e. water, sewer, paved streets, etc.).

Topography: Describes the collective physical features of a geographic area.

Urban: Pertaining to, or comprising a city or town, thus benefiting from urban level public services.

Visual Form Map: A map associated with the Community Appearance Technical report, which identifies key vistas, landmarks, paths, and nodes throughout the city which can serve to enhance the overall aesthetic imagery.

Wetlands: **An** area of standing water that serves to filter water down to recharge the groundwater and also serves as habitat.

Xeriscape: The concept of utilizing native plants, grasses, landscaping thus requiring low water and low maintenance.

Zero Lot Line: Development in which a building is permitted to be placed abutting one or more of the property's lot lines. This provides a larger area of contiguous open space on the lot.
