

**MINUTES OF MEETING OF
BOARD OF ELECTRICAL APPEALS**

February 9, 2010 - 3:00 p.m.

Vice-Chairman Dave Urban called the meeting to order at 3:05 pm, with Board members Tim Lenz, Mike Kilian, Brad Bishop and Secretary Tom Kerschen present. Also present was City attorney Jeff Vanzandt. Board members Scott Alder, Harold Ragland and Shane Chapman were absent.

The minutes of the January 12, 2010 meeting were read. Board member Kilian made a motion the minutes be approved as written, it was seconded by Board member Bishop and approved.

Under the New Business section of the agenda part A, Secretary Kerschen presented the Board with test outlines specifically designed for sign builders and sign installers. Prometric, the national testing agency recognized by the State of Kansas for trade certification testing, has a Journeyman Sign Electrical 50 question open-book test and a Master Sign Electrical 50 question open-book test. The tests are designed to test a candidate's knowledge of the design, plan, installation, repair, alteration and maintenance of electrical conductors, raceways and equipment associated with electric signs. The branch

circuit supply power to the sign shall originate from an existing disconnect or power outlet. Secretary Kerschen is to present information, in future meetings; on the safety issues that exist today and how certifying the installers and licensing the companies to do the electrical connections would make a safer installation for the worker and the public.

With no other business to conduct, Board member Lenz made a motion to adjourn. Board member Bishop seconded the motion and the meeting adjourned.
