WPD Announces New Police Captain Veteran Lieutenant Troy Livingston promoted

Wichita Police Chief Norman Williams announced today that Lieutenant Troy Livingston has been promoted to Police Captain. Livingston will begin his responsibilities as captain of the Patrol South Bureau on Saturday, February 6.

“Captain Livingston has demonstrated tremendous knowledge and experience in the area of public safety and community service,” Police Chief Norman Williams said. “He is extremely knowledgeable and insightful about community policing. He is a dedicated and innovative person, who has established himself as a change agent.”

Livingston, who joins ten other WPD captains, graduated from the law enforcement training academy on October 21, 1995. He has served as Detective, Sergeant, and Lieutenant. His professional assignments have included Patrol, Planning and Research, Community Policing Officer and Burglary Detective. As a Lieutenant, he has held assignments as Training Academy Recruit Instructor, Community Policing Section, Patrol Watch Commander and Sex Crimes/Domestic Violence Section. He is a member of the Wichita Police Department Honor Guard.

Livingston’s professional and community awards include Bronze Wreath of Meritorious Service, Distinguished Service, Civic Achievement, Perfect Attendance, Safe Driving, Certificate of Commendation, and several Commendatory Performance Reports.

Livingston holds a Masters Degree in Public Administration and a Master of Arts in Criminal Justice, both from Wichita State University. He also earned a Bachelor of Science in Criminal Justice, from University of Houston-Downtown, Houston, TX and an Associate of Applied Science Degree in Criminal Justice from Seward County Community College in Liberal, KS.

He has participated in various training seminars sponsored by the Federal Bureau of Investigations: General States Law Enforcement Executive Development Seminar, 17th Session, Council on Law Enforcement Education and Training, Center for Advanced Public Safety Research and the Kansas Law Enforcement Training Center.
