MINUTES - BOARD OF BIDS AND CONTRACTS*

The Board of Bids and Contracts met with Shirley Rogers, Division Supervisor, Department of Public Works in the Chair; Jay Newton, Capital Improvement Coordinator, Finance/Budget, representing the Budget Officer; Fanny Chan, Controllers Office, representing the Director of Finance; Greg Clay, Management Intern, representing the City Manager's Office, and Deborah Tadlock, Secretary to City Clerk, present.
