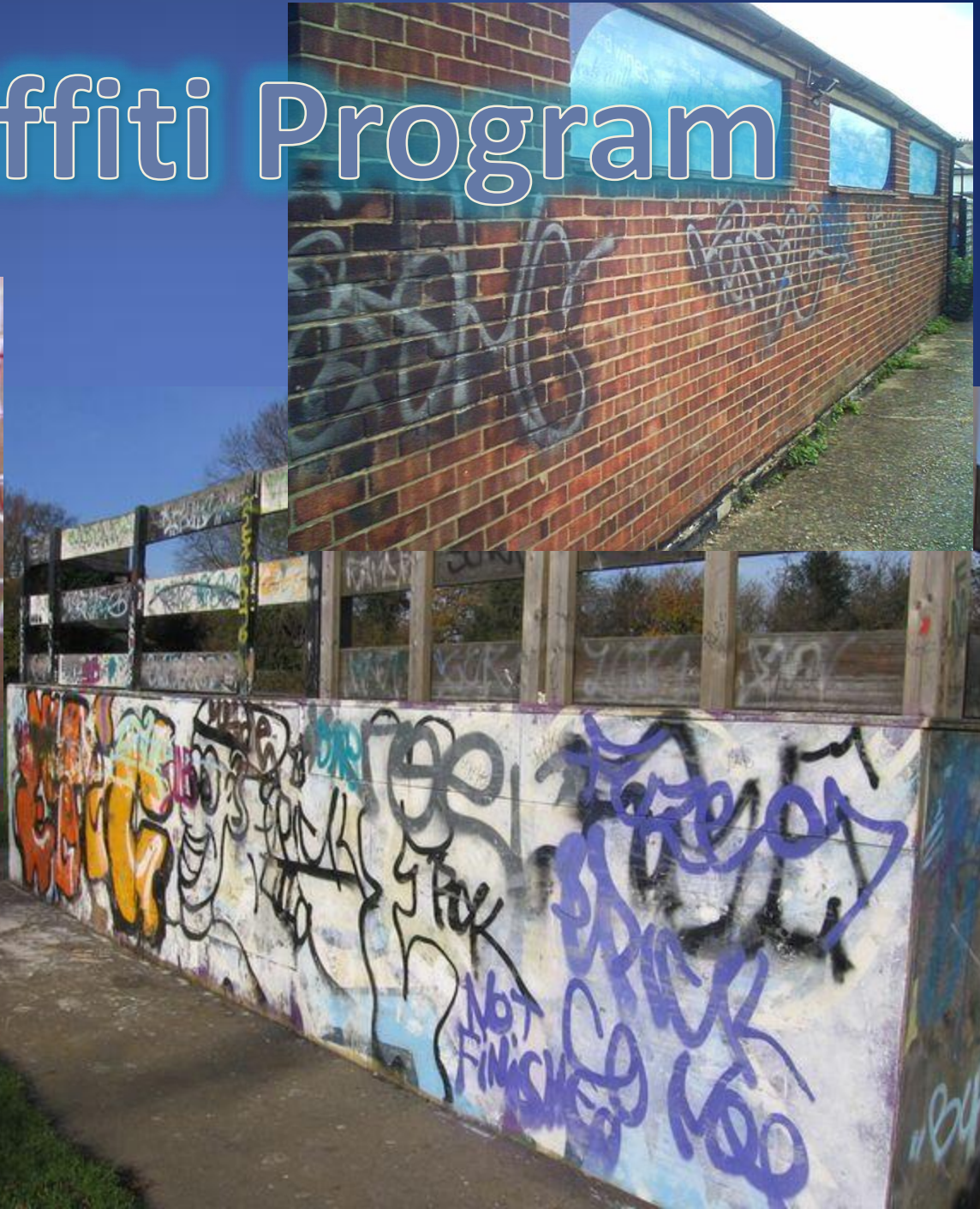

- 1,876 removals

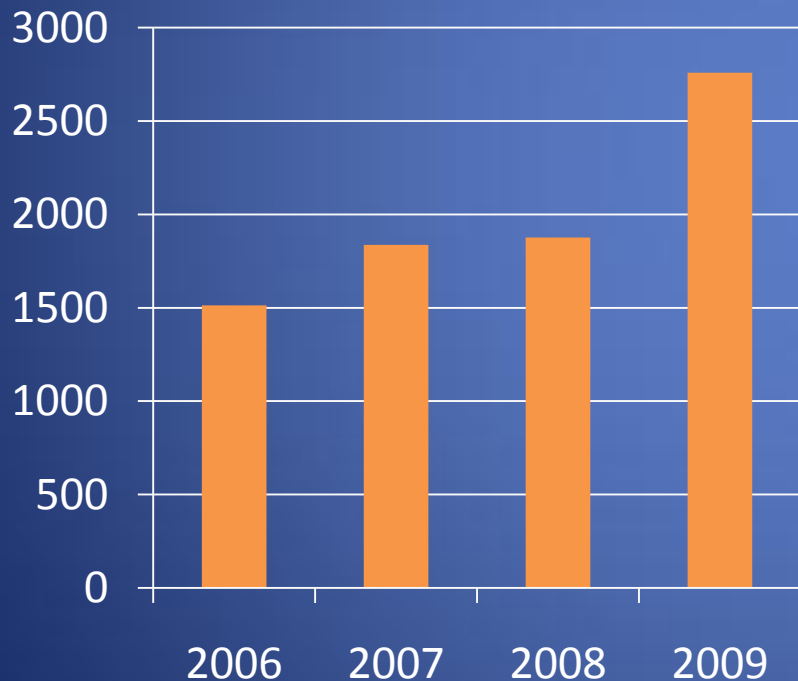
2009

of Graffiti Clean-ups

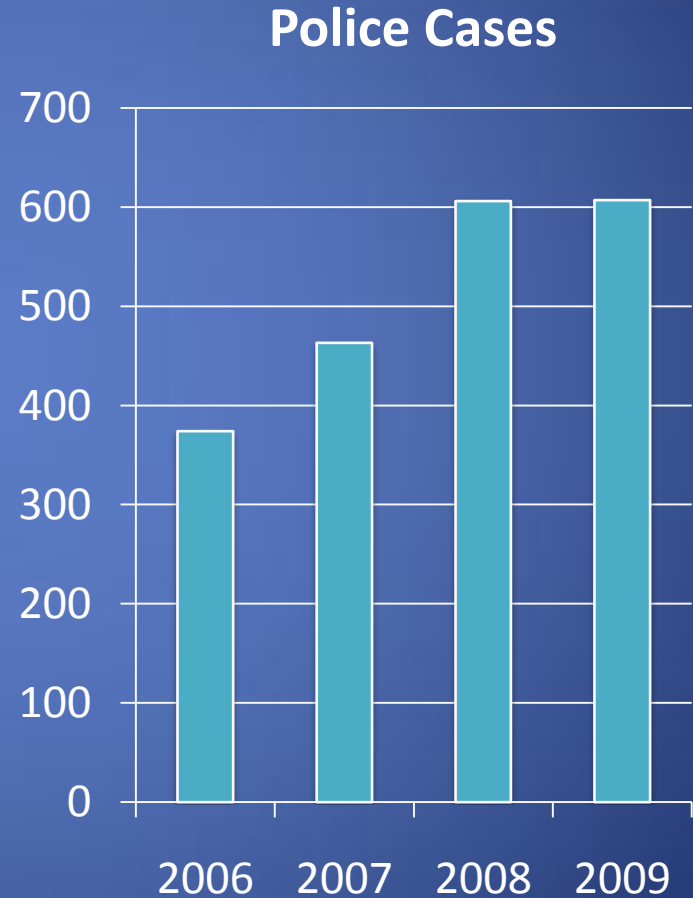

Police Cases

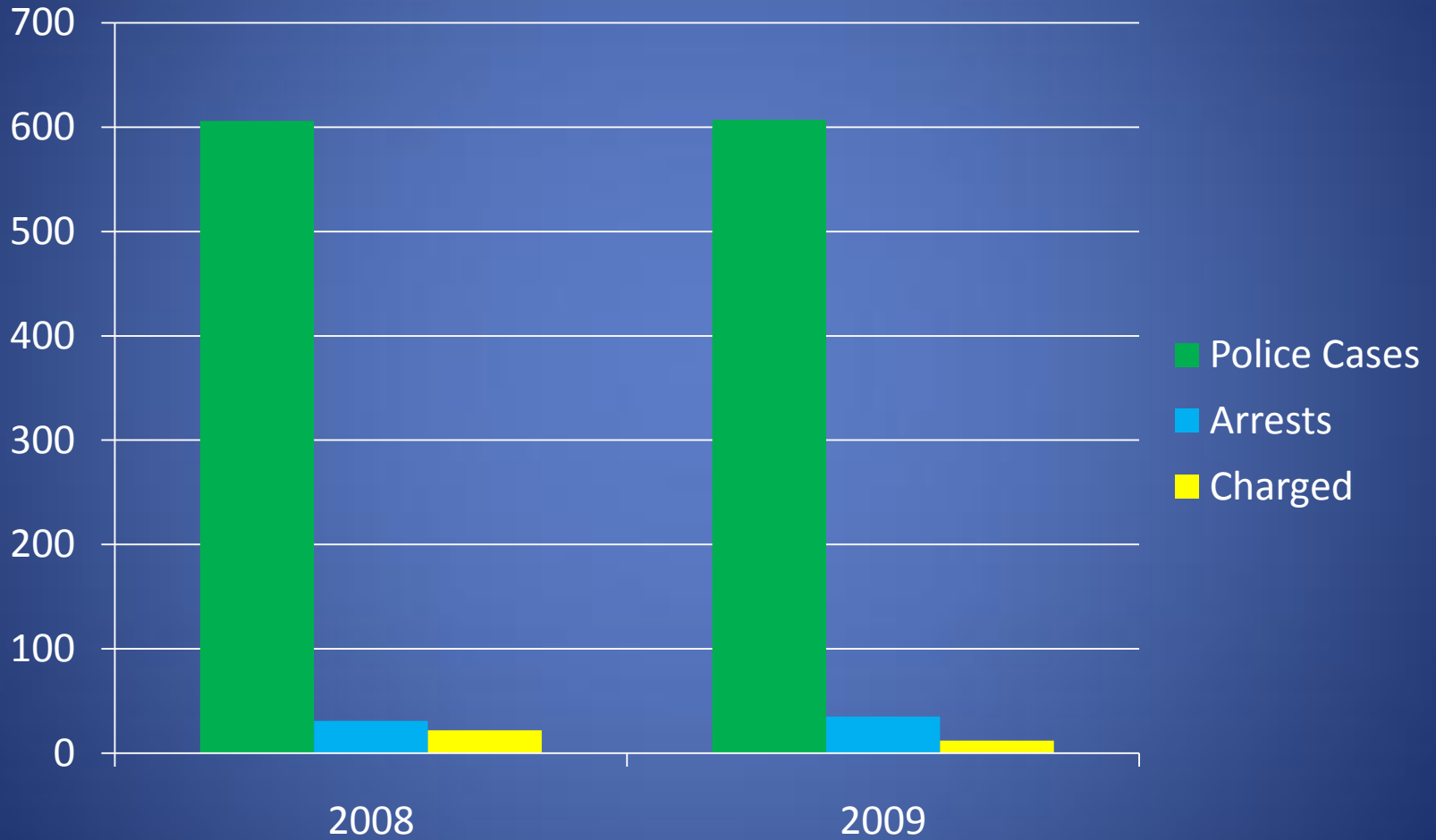
2008

Business Survey

- 53 local businesses surveyed Spring 2009
- Owners were given a copy of the proposed ordinances.
- Possession of Graffiti Implements by Minors
 - 86% Support
 - 14% Do Not Support
- Implements Prohibited in Designated Public Places
 - 88% Support
 - 12% Do Not Support
- Limiting Access to Graffiti Implements
 - 81% Support
 - 19% Do Not Support

Stakeholder Demographics

- 100% of the Businesses Sell Graffiti Implements.

5.37.030

5.37.030 Defacement or Damage of Property by Graffiti

Any person who writes, sprays, scratches, or otherwise affixes graffiti upon any property, public or private, in which another has an interest and without the consent of such other person shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof shall be punished by a fine of not less than two hundred fifty dollars or more than one thousand dollars, or by imprisonment for not more than six months, or by both such fine and imprisonment. In addition to such penalty the court may order the defendant to perform the necessary labor to clean up, repair, or replace the property damaged by that person or to pay any costs incurred by the owner related to the cleanup, repair or replacement of property damaged by that person.

Proposed City Ordinance Additions

Graffiti Implements

- Graffiti Implements Defined: any aerosol paint container, **broad-tipped marker**, gum label, **paint stick or graffiti stick**, etching equipment, brush or any other device capable of scarring or leaving a visible mark on any natural or manmade surface.

Broad-tipped marker: any marker or similar implement which has a writing tip which is $\frac{1}{2}$ inch wide or greater, and contains anything other than a solution that can be removed with water after the solution dries.

Paint stick or graffiti stick: any device containing a solid form of paint, chalk, wax, epoxy or other similar substance capable of being applied to a surface by pressure and leaving a mark of at least one-eighth of an inch in width.

Gum label: any material such as decals, stickers, posters, or labels, which contain a substance commonly known as adhesive or glue, which cannot be removed from the surface in an intact condition and with minimal effort.

Possession of Graffiti Implements by Minors Prohibited

...it is unlawful for any person under 18 years of age to have in his or her possession any graffiti implement while on any public private or parochial school property, grounds, facilities, buildings, or structures, or within 100 feet of such properties, or upon private property without the prior written consent of the owner or occupant of such private property. The provisions of this section shall not apply to the possession of felt tip markers by minors attending, or traveling to or from school at which the minor is enrolled, if the minor is participating in a class at said school which formally requires the possession of felt tip markers.

Possession of Graffiti Implements Prohibited in Designated Public Places

... it is unlawful for any person to have in his/her possession any graffiti implement while in, upon or within one hundred (100) feet of any public facility, park, playground, swimming pool, skate park, recreational facility, or other public building owned or operated by the city, county, state, or federal government, or while in, under or within 100 feet of an underpass, bridge abutment, storm drain, spillway or similar types of infrastructure unless otherwise authorized.

Limiting Access to Graffiti Implements

...It shall be unlawful for any person, other than a parent or legal guardian, to sell, exchange, give, loan, or otherwise furnish, or cause or permit to be exchanged, given, loaned, or otherwise furnished, any aerosol paint container to any person under the age of 18 years without the written consent of the parents or guardian of the person.

Limiting Access to Graffiti Implements

....It shall be unlawful for any person to sell, deliver, give, exchange, or lend, or cause or permit to be sold, exchanged, given, loaned, or otherwise furnished any graffiti implements to any person who appears to be under the age of twenty-one (21) years without having first verified the individual's age by means of a photographic identification card such as a driver's license, state identification card, passport, or military identification.

Changes to Proposed Ordinance

Graffiti Implements Defined: any aerosol paint container, **broad-tipped marker**, gum label, paint stick or graffiti stick, etching equipment, brush or any other device capable of scarring or leaving a visible mark on any natural or manmade surface.

Broad-tipped marker: any marker or similar implement which has a writing tip which is $\frac{1}{2}$ inch wide or greater, and contains anything other than a solution that can be removed with water after the solution dries.

Subject Stops

- **K.S.A. 22-2402:**

Stopping of suspect. (1) Without making an arrest, a law enforcement officer may stop any person in a public place whom such officer reasonably suspects is committing, has committed or is about to commit a crime and may demand of the name, address of such suspect and an explanation of such suspect's actions. (2) When a law enforcement officer has stopped a person for questioning pursuant to this section and reasonably suspects that such officer's personal safety requires it, such officer may frisk such person for firearms or other dangerous weapons. If the law enforcement officer finds a firearm or weapon, or other thing, the possession of which may be a crime or evidence of crime, such officer may take and keep it until the completion of the questioning, at which time such officer shall either return it, if lawfully possessed, or arrest such person.

Subject Stops

- WPD Policy 301.06

Without making an arrest, a law enforcement officer may stop any person in a public place who the officer reasonably suspects is committing, has committed, or is about to commit a crime, and may demand of that person his/her name, address, and an explanation of his/her actions.

If the officer has articulable suspicion or suspects that his/her personal safety requires it, he/she may pat down the person for firearms or other dangerous weapons. If the officer finds a firearm or weapon, or other item, the possession of which may be a crime or evidence of a crime, he/she may take and keep it until the completion of the questioning, at which time he/she shall either return it, if lawfully possessed, or arrest such person .
