3. WPD/Community Police Report

Officer F. Tejeda, WPD, reported on beats 16, 18, 19, and 199 and District V Neighborhoods.

- ✓ 16 Beat-decrease in murder, increase in residential and non-residential burglaries.
- ✓ 18 Beat-increase in rape cases and non-residential burglaries, decrease in robberies.
- ✓ 19 Beat- increase in residential and non-residential burglaries, decrease in auto larcenies.
- ✓ 199 Beat-increase in rape cases, robbery cases, residential and non-residential burglaries.

Other

Bryan Frye asked about the YTD accident rates at Central and Ridge vs. Central and Tyler where there are now dual turn lanes. **Tejeda** responded that the rates are 5 accidents at Central and Ridge and 3 at Central and Tyler. No connection can be made because of the turn lane situation.

Wendi White shared that on 29th between Maize and Tyler she noticed 2 officers “hiding” at a corner laser tagging for speeding. She asked about the safety of this action. **Tejeda** noted the comment.

- 45,000 alarms
- 4 fire deaths: 2 careless smoking, 1 smoking was suspected, 1 undetermined.
