Free Neighborhood Cleanups

Any neighborhood where at least a portion of the area falls in the "<u>very low to moderate</u>" income bracket will qualify for a **no-cost City funded** cleanup.

Cleanup equipment will be provided to eligible neighborhoods on a "first come, first served" basis and will be supported until funds are exhausted. Applications will be given scheduling priority based on the order in which they are received. **The City no longer support the Dollars for Doers program** (25% of the cleanup costs paid by the neighborhood & 75% paid by the City). Neighborhoods who have utilized this subsidized program in the past may contact the Neighborhood Cleanup Facilitator for information about working directly with vendors to schedule their own cleanups.

PROGRAM GUIDELINES and APPLICATION PROCESS

Neighborhoods are responsible for enlisting their own volunteers, disseminating information to the residences of the cleanup area, and organizing the event. Groups wanting to have a cleanup where there is no neighborhood association or HOA can apply for a cleanup in their neighborhood as small as a 6-block area. When requesting equipment, please keep your requests to a minimum. Excessive equipment orders will be denied based on previous year's records. Informed citizens and volunteers is what makes a great and flawless neighborhood cleanup.

Each request is reviewed on an application basis, needs of the neighborhood, and available funding.

IMPORTANT ADMINISTRATIVE ITEMS

- The scheduling team will attempt to give neighborhoods their first or second choice of dates, but that may not always be possible.
- C All cleanups must end ON TIME. If you are concerned about running past noon, then plan accordingly and start your clean up earlier or reduce the size of your area. The number of volunteers and the equipment requested make a HUGE difference in the size of your cleanup. For each packer truck you should have a minimum of 3 volunteers; 2 volunteers need to be assigned to each skid (roll-off dumpster). Do not take on more than you can do in a 4 − 5 hour time period. ALL cleanups end at NOON (12:00 pm).

IMPORTANT OPERATIONAL ITEMS

- Anything set out for the cleanup must be bagged, boxed or bundled. Volunteers will not pick up scattered household trash. The purpose of the cleanup is to pick up large items that are costly to dispose of. Household trash should be picked up as a part of your regular trash service; and therefore will not be collected.
- No trash carts will be emptied. Trash carts are part of residents' regular trash service and will not be emptied as a part of the neighborhood cleanup.
- All tree waste and brush MUST BE BUNDLED if being picked up by a packer truck. Bundles need to be tied/secured and should be no more than 4 feet long and no more than 12 inches in diameter. Tree waste that is hauled to skids does not have to be bundled. Large tree trunks, over-sized logs, and un-bundled tree waste will not be picked up. These items will be left behind if not bundled properly and will be the property owner's responsibility to remove.
- **○** You <u>MUST</u> work with a metal recycler/scrapper and provide their name and phone number.
- If City staff is made aware of any resident who charges another party to leave items on their property for the cleanup, the items at that location will not be picked up and it will be up to the resident living there to dispose of them.
- Truck drivers and volunteers will only pass a residence ONE time. Have items ready the night before the cleanup to ensure they are picked up.
- ⊃ Public Works staff will not go to a neighborhood and pick up items following a neighborhood cleanup. It will be the property owner's responsibility to dispose of the items.
- **○** No CONCRETE or CONSTRUCTION MATERIALS will be picked up.

- ◆ No HAZARDOUS materials such as paint, pesticides, appliances with Freon, etc., will be picked up by the contracted waste hauler.
- ➡ All tires must be taken to where the tire truck is accepting tires for your area on the day of the cleanup.
- Scheduled cleanups are never canceled due to snow or rain!

NEIGHBORHOOD CLEANUP CHECK LIST

- ➤ VERIFY THE ROUTE THE CLEANUP WILL TAKE WITH THE DRIVERS AND THE VOLUNTEERS. NO VOLUNTEERS ARE ALLOWED TO RIDE WITH, OR GRAB ON TO, THE PACKER TRUCKS (TRASH TRUCKS)!
- ➤ REVIEW ITEMS WITH VOLUNTEERS THAT WON'T BE PICKED UP BY WASTE HAULERS: HAZARDOUS MATERIALS, APPLIANCES WITH REFRIGERANT, CONCRETE, UNBUNDLED TREE WASTE, SCATTERED TRASH.
- ALL SKIDS AND TRUCKS MUST BE EMPTY OF ANY WASTE BEFORE BEGINNING A CLEANUP. IF THERE IS ALREADY WASTE INSIDE EITHER UPON ARRIVAL, PLEASE REPORT TO THE ORGANIZER ASAP!
- ➢ PICK UP AT CURBSIDE ONLY DO NOT PICK UP ANYTHING ON PRIVATE PROPERTY UNLESS REQUESTED BY THE PROPERTY OCCUPANT
- MAKE SURE THERE ARE MONITORS (VOLUNTEERS) AT ALL SKIDS TO PREVENT OVER-FILLING OR DUMPING OF UNAUTHORIZED ITEMS (ITEMS MUST NOT EXCEED THE TOP OF THE SKID). TO ORDER REPLACEMENT SKID, CALL THE NUMBER ON THE SKID. YOU WILL NEED TO CALL 838-5885 BEFORE 10:30 am.
- ALL TIRES MUST BE TAKEN TO A STATIONARY LOCATION WHERE TIRE TRUCK WILL STAY PARKED. THE LOCATION MUST BE STATED ON YOUR FLIER. TIRES FROM BUSINESS/COMMERCIAL LOCATIONS WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED. THE DRIVER OF THE TIRE TRUCK WILL MAKE ALL DECISIONS ABOUT ACCEPTING TIRES, AND MIGHT ASK FOR AN I.D.
- ➤ BE SURE TO FILL OUT AND TURN IN THE AFTER-CLEANUP REPORT. FAILURE TO DO SO COULD IMPACT YOUR ABILITY TO HAVE A CLEANUP IN FUTURE YEARS.
- > TAKE A HEAD COUNT OF VOLUNTEERS AND INCLUDE THAT ON THE REPORT FORM. *This is important.*
- DO **NOT** PUT OUT SIGNS ON BUSY ARTERIAL STREETS ADVERTISING YOUR CLEANUP. THIS COULD RESULT IN ILLEGAL DUMPING AT YOUR CLEANUP, AND EVEN THE NIGHT BEFORE. MANY "ADVERTISED" CLEANUPS HAVE HAD TIRES FROM BUSINESSES DUMPED IN THEIR NEIGHBORHOODS.

HANDLE ANY CONFLICT THAT MIGHT OCCUR IN A PROFESSIONAL MANNER.

Household trash should be picked up as a part of your regular trash service and will not be collected. (If you notice a residence without trash service, please report it to your Community Services Representative.)
- No trash carts will be emptied. Trash carts are part of residents' regular trash service and will not be emptied as a part of the neighborhood cleanup.
- → All tree waste and brush MUST BE BUNDLED if being picked up by a packer truck. Bundles need to be tied/secured and should be no more than 4 feet long and no more than 12 inches in diameter. Tree waste that is hauled to skids does not have to be bundled.
- ➡ If City staff is made aware of any resident who charges another party to leave items on their property for the cleanup, the items at that location will not be picked up and it will be up to the resident living there to dispose of them.
- The packer truck drivers and volunteers will only visit a property **once**.
- **○** All tires must be taken to the site where the tire truck has been instructed to park.
- ⇒ NO CONCRETE OR CONSTRUCTION DEBRIS will be picked up
- ⇒ NO TIRES will be accepted from a business or commercial entity!
- NO HAZARDOUS materials such as paint, pesticides, appliances with Freon, batteries, CFL lightbulbs, etc., will be picked up

REMEMBER – BOXED, BAGGED OR BUNDLED!

INSTRUCTIONS FOR SKID MONITORS/VOLUNTEERS:

Skid (Roll-off) Information for the neighborhood cleanup

•	NO CONCRETE OR BRICKS
•	NO TIRES (ALL tires have to be taken to the designated drop-off location)
	O TIRE TRUCK LOCATION:
•	NO HAZARDOUS materials such as paint, pesticides, appliances with Freon, batteries,
	CFL lightbulbs, etc.*
•	Close the skid/dumpster before the items begin to spill out. (if it has an end door)
•	Do not pile trash higher than the top of the skid, they must be covered for transport.
•	To order replacement skids, call 838-5885 before 10:30 am.
•	Place anything metal at the curb or next to skid so the metal scrapper can pick it up.
•	Volunteers have the discretion to ask a driver for their I.D. before allowing them to use
	the skid.
•	It is legal for a neighborhood group to ask for donations, but CANNOT require a
	donation from those in the neighborhood that are using the service.
