

# PROCLAMATION

of

## The City of Wichita, Kansas

Founded in 1870

**Whereas**, September 11, 2011, marks the 10<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the terrorist attacks on American soil that claimed the lives of nearly 3,000 citizens; and

**Whereas**, the citizens of the United States of America, including residents of Kansas and the City of Wichita, responded to the tragedy by joining together to assist the thousands in need affected by this tragedy; and

**Whereas**, to commemorate those who have paid the ultimate price, the City is asking every Wichita resident to cease all other activity at 12 noon Sunday, Sept. 11, 2011, for one minute in solemn tribute to the victims, first responders, and countless others who were affected by the horror that unfolded before millions of viewers around the world; and

**Whereas**, it is requested that for one minute at 12 noon, Sunday, Sept. 11, all citizens cease all work or other activity, fly the American flag and and sound all bells, whistles, sirens, horns or other appropriate devices to signal we are united, strong and prepared;

**Now, Therefore, Be It Resolved**, that I, Carl Brewer, Mayor of the City of Wichita, Kansas, do hereby proclaim September 11, 2011, as

and ask all citizens to reaffirm their American values as they remember the suffering and loss of life resulting from the terrorist attacks.
