

Making Decisions, Taking Action



Overview for Community Partners

What is ACT ICT?

ACT ICT is the third and final phase of a process that asks the community to determine priorities and make decisions for now and generations to come.

What were the other phases?

The first phase was a series of focus groups late last year to get feedback on the issues and help structure the second phase – a community survey conducted early this year to gather broad citizen input on priorities and the issues, such as jobs, water, infrastructure, public transportation, parks and downtown and more.

What is the format for this phase?

A facilitator will come anywhere people are meeting and in an hour or less walk the group through a process that includes discussion and input on a vision for our community's future; priorities for the issues facing us; and input about preferred funding methods.

What groups are we talking about?

All groups! Wherever people are meeting, we want hear from them. These include faith and business groups, employee, non-profit board and staff, labor, neighborhood, association and professional organizations, service clubs and any other group.

What is the timing?

Sessions will be scheduled through the end of the year. A report with the collective feedback will be available in February 2014 and presented to the community, elected leaders and community leaders.

What do you need from us?

As a partner in our future, we need your help on three things:

- 1) Schedule a presentation for your group, board and/or staff to participate and let your voices be heard;
- 2) Inform your members and stakeholders about this opportunity and encourage them to share their input (invitation for them attached);
- 3) Encourage everyone's participation in setting priorities for our community's future.
