



Concert Hall Renovation Summary

- **\$222,000 spent on stage improvements, which included:**
 - Replacement of entire scenic rigging system. Rigging includes the ropes and cables that are used to lift backdrops/scenery on and off stage. The rigging that was in place was original to the theater when it opened in January 1969. New rigging greatly improves safety on stage. (Convention Hall's rigging was also replaced in conjunction with this project.)
 - Replacement of all dimmer modules that brighten or dim lights on stage. As with the rigging, the system in use was original to Concert Hall and had become obsolete and replacement parts were no longer available.

- **\$721,000 spent on improvements to the hall, which included:**
 - Removal of 2,200 seats and installation of new chairs manufactured by American Seating Co. The configuration of the seats remained unchanged as to not affect season ticket holders. The new chairs have increased padding and ergonomic qualities.
 - Addition of glow edges on steps to increase safety for people going in and out of the hall during performances when house lights are down.
 - Improvement to the location of handicap accessible seating.
 - Equipping 22 aisle seats with flip armrests to meet ADA requirements.
 - Installation of energy-efficient LED lighting.
 - Painting of walls, ceiling and floor.
 - Laying of new carpet laid on aisles and entryways.
