



FACT SHEET

Numana, Inc. is a non-profit 501(c)(3) public charity formed in August, 2008 as an international hunger relief organization. We believe that God cares deeply for His children who are starving and delights when we, who have plenty, share with those who have nothing.

Our mission is to empower people to save the starving.

Our core capability is facilitating Food Packaging Events where hundreds of volunteers serve two-hour shifts in an assembly-line fashion packaging simple, nutritious meals.

Our goal is to package at least one 40' shipping container (285,120 meals) at a time for delivery to areas where intense food insecurity exists.

Our meals consist of rice, soy protein, freeze-dried vegetables, and 21 vitamins and minerals targeted to help the immune system of malnourished people. These ingredients are measured into bags, sealed, boxed and prepared for shipment at our events.

The cost of each life-sustaining meal is only 30 cents. This includes all of the ingredients, packaging, administration and international shipping of the container.

Our partner, The Salvation Army World Service Office, is responsible for distribution of our meals to school feeding programs in the most impoverished areas of the world. School feeding has proven to be one of the most effective solutions to stopping hunger and breaking the poverty cycle.

Local Food Banks also benefit as participants are encouraged to bring non-perishable food donations the day of the event.

BOARD OF DIRECTORS

Rick McNary serves as the President and CEO of Numana, Inc. His vast experience in community and ministry leadership has prepared him well for this global mission. Rick pastored in Potwin, KS, for over twenty years. He established an “Adopt-a-Village” model in Nicaragua, whereby churches can help poor villages in third world countries foster long-term sustainability. He has led numerous mission teams to Africa and Central America for medical and hunger relief, evangelism, church planting, and pastor training. Rick has been trained as a Master Facilitator by the Kansas Health Foundation. He is also a motivational speaker and writer. Rick lives in Potwin, KS. He is married with five children.

Bob Dole is one of the most prominent political figures of our time. Raised on the plains of western Kansas, he served as a platoon leader in the Second World War and was gravely wounded on the battlefield in 1945. He was honored with two Purple Hearts and a Bronze Star with Oak Leaf Cluster. In Congress, he was a member of the House of Representatives, Senate Majority Leader, Chairman of the Senate Finance Committee, and Chairman of the Republican Party. In 1996 he ran as the Republican Presidential nominee. He recently co-authored a book with George McGovern entitled Ending Hunger Now: A Challenge to Persons of Faith.

George McGovern is also one of the most prominent political figures of our time. As a B-24 bomber pilot in World War II, he flew 35 missions and earned the Distinguished Flying Cross. He was first elected to Congress in 1956. In 1960 President John F. Kennedy appointed him the first director of the Food For Peace Program and Special Assistant to the President, where he oversaw the donation of millions of tons of food to developing nations. He served in the Senate from 1962 to 1980 and ran as the 1972 Democrat Presidential nominee. In 2001 he was appointed the first United Nations global ambassador on hunger. He recently co-authored a book with Bob Dole entitled Ending Hunger Now: A Challenge to Persons of Faith.

Dr. H. Richard Kuhns, II, is a partner with Internal Medicine Specialists at Susan B. Allen Memorial Hospital in El Dorado, KS. He serves as a Clinical Instructor at the University of Kansas School of Medicine in Wichita, KS. He has been privileged with numerous board directorships, including Boy Scouts of America and Bethlehem House, a refuge for unwed pregnant girls. Dr. Kuhns lives in El Dorado, KS, with his wife and three children, where he is also an avid photographer.
